This monthly stakeholders' report provides an update on the financial and operational performance of New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing.





## **Key Projects as at January**

Project	Commentary	Status
Race Club Partnership Program	The roll out of the race club partnership program has commenced with eight race clubs. Feedback from these pilot clubs will be incorporated into the full roll-out due to commence by 31 March 2014. Stakeholder surveys for initial race clubs will roll out in the next fortnight. Racecourse venue inspections have been conducted at a number of South Island racecourses.	
2014-15 Race Dates	A meeting of the regional programming chairs was held in Wellington on 18 December 2013 to finalise the initial draft roll-over calendar which will be discussed with NZRB and the other codes on 17 January 2014. Draft 1 2014/15 Racing Calendar will be distributed to Clubs on 24 <sup>th</sup> February 2014.	
Minimum Top Weight Proposal	This issue will have further industry consultation prior to consideration by the NZTR Board on 20 February 2014.	
Thoroughbred Brand	A meeting of the marketing group was held at Karaka on 14 December 2013 and supported the continuation of the development of a thoroughbred racing brand for launch in November 2014. A proposal from Interbrand will be considered by the NZTR Board at its February meeting.

Synthetic Track	NZTR is still working with the NZRB on the synthetic trials and training track proposed at Cambridge or Matamata. NZTR is holding \$2m to fund its share of the project. Two preferred providers are being evaluated for site engineering and survey assessment.					
Impact of proposed Health & Safety Legislative changes	NZTR is working with the NZRB and other codes to review current racing club Health & Safety practices and understand what impact there may be to clubs under the proposed changes to Heath & Safety legislation.					
New caddy gates for Northern and Central regions	NZTR is working with Northern Raceday Services and Mike Alton Engineering to design and build a new set of caddy gates for use in the Northern region. A meeting is being held at Counties on 13 February with representatives from the Northern and Central Starting Gate crews and management to see the prototype gates in action. NZTR is also looking at the practicalities of having a mobile set of overhead gates available in the North and Central Districts to service the strategic and significant venues.					
On-course Wi-Fi evaluation	The trial of a potential on-course Wi-Fi solution was conducted at Trentham on Saturday 25 January. The trial is currently being evaluated and a second trial has tentatively been scheduled over Auckland Cup week.					
Self-Service Terminals	25 self service terminals have been ordered for use at Ellerslie (6), Te Rapa (4), New Plymouth (3), Awapuni (4), Trentham (4) and Riccarton (4). It is anticipated that delivery of the self-service terminals will be in April/May 2014.					
Sectional Timing System	Currently in test and evaluation phase. Once the units have been produced it is intended to undertake live-trialling at Ellerslie and, once completed, roll the system out to all meetings by 1 August 2014.

### **Matters for Information**

#### 1. NZTR BOARD

Des Friedrich attended his last meeting of the NZTR Board on 24 January and departed for Australia on 25 January. The Members' Council met on 24 January after the Board meeting and has begun the recruitment process to fill this vacancy.

#### 2. NZTR MEMBERS' COUNCIL

The Members' Council met with the Board on 24 January to review and appraise the performance of the Board. The Council meets with the Board twice each year. Charles Whyte (Central Region) has resigned from the Members' Council. This vacancy will be filled by appointment by the Members' Council. In accordance with clause 10.7 of the Constitution, every person who fills a casual vacancy will hold the seat until the next AGM (in November 2014) and will be eligible for re-election.

#### 3. THOROUGHBREDS IN EQUESTRIAN SPORT (TIES)

A partnership between NZTR and Equestrian Sports New Zealand (ESNZ), titled Thoroughbreds in Equestrian Sport (TiES), promoting opportunities for second careers for thoroughbreds in equestrian sport, has begun.

2014 TiES events will be held as follows:

- The TiES Jumping Competitions will take place at the National Championships, National Equestrian Centre McLeans Island, Christchurch, 6-9 February 2014 and Taranaki Showjumping Series Finals, 8-9 March 2014
- The TiES Dressage Competitions took place at the South Island Dressage Championships, National Equestrian Centre McLeans Island, 24-26 January and will follow on to the National Championships, Manfeild, 27 February 1 March
- The TiES Eventing Competitions will take place at the National Equestrian Centre McLeans Island, 1 March 2014, Te Rapa, Waikato, 19-20 April 2014 and Central Districts, 26-27 April 2014

#### 4. NOTIFICATION OF DEATH OR DE-REGISTRATION OF A HORSE

In November 2013 NZTR introduced a new Rule to the Rules of Racing which offers de-registration of a horse from racing and/or breeding and places certain requirements on the owner of a horse leaving the racing industry to inform NZTR when a horse is sold or gifted to another party, including the full identity and contact details of the new owner. #### 5. FREE-TO-AIR BROADCAST: HERBIE DYKE STAKES

Prime will broadcast the Group 1 Herbie Dyke Stakes on Saturday, February 8. This race will run as Race 7 at 4.19pm, although Prime will be on air from 4pm. In terms of the raceday schedule this time is ideal for Prime as Trackside will be able to offer a generous lead-in window to viewers.

#### 6. PAEROA

The Waikato Racing Club has indicated it intends to cease racing activity at Paeroa from August 1. The course (36.8ha), which has hosted races for almost 140 years, is now for sale. All up, the site comprises eight properties, with mixed residential and active reserve zoning. Tenders close February 27.

#### 7. ASIAN RACING CONFERENCE

The 35<sup>th</sup> Asian Racing Conference will be held in Hong Kong from May 5-8 2014.

#### 8. AUSTRALASIAN RACING MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

The annual conference of Australasian Racing Ministers will be hosted by the Minister for Racing, the Hon. Nathan Guy, in Wellington on 28 February. The conference will be attended by the Chairs and CEOs of the New Zealand racing Codes and the NZ Racing Board. Each party will be making submissions.

#### 9. KARAKA SALES

Good results at New Zealand Bloodstock's National Yearling Sales series.

Waikato Stud principals Mark and Lisa Chittick become the leading vendors by aggregate in the Premier session. Waikato Stud sold 46 yearlings for a total of \$7,655,000 at an average of \$166,413 to top the aggregate list.

Market conditions have been challenging this year – particularly in light of the currently strong New Zealand dollar – but sales figures across the Premier and Select sales ere reasonably solid.

While Premier sales figures were slightly down on last year, there has been a steady gain in Select sale numbers.
