#### FROM THE HORSE'S MOUTH

NZTR convened a meeting last Tuesday in Hamilton to discuss Authorised Syndication of Thoroughbreds.

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss ways to simplify the process and encourage a greater uptake of Authorised Syndication from syndicators and trainers.

The review of the current process falls into place with NZTR's plan to complete an ownership review that will benefit everyone in the industry.

I was pleased to have in attendance eighteen stakeholders including ten current Authorised Syndicators who all welcomed the opportunity to discuss openly their concerns and feedback on the current process.

NZTR will look to provide updates on these projects as they take shape.

## **ATTENTION ALL TRAINERS - EQUINE RESEARCH SURVEY**

One of our key aims at the Equine Research Centre at Massey University is to work together with breeders and trainers to understand the production and management of horses in the racing industry in New Zealand.

Its latest research focuses on the control of parasites in high value horses with the aim to decrease worming costs and maintaining the long term health and quality of horses in the industry.

In recent years there has been an increasing problem of resistance to de-worming products in horses worldwide. Due to this, some of the treatments available to treat parasites in horses may no longer be effective. High parasite burdens may affect the health, performance and welfare of horses.

This project aims to understand the current parasite control practices within the racing industry in New Zealand and assess whether resistance to de-worming products is present.

As a first step we need your help to find out about how and why you are worming your horses.

#### **RACING AT TE AROHA**

This meeting was abandoned at 6.30am this morning. There has been a significant amount of damage to the running rail, hurdle fences and racecourse property in general. There are branches and debris over the course proper and a large clean up job will be required. As a result, Alan Cole (R.I.U) and Graeme Amies (Te Aroha Course Manager) said that any option to re-schedule the meeting this week is not a viable, or realistic option at this stage.

Several horses that were due to race at Te Aroha were Late Nominated for the Wellington RC meeting Saturday 12 July. Those not catered for by making the trip South to Wellington will have the opportunity to go to the Waikato RC meeting on Saturday 19 July or the Racing Tauranga meeting on Wednesday 16 July.

### **WHANGAREI RC 12 JULY - TRANSFERRED TO AVONDALE**

Due to the damage caused by ongoing extreme weather conditions, the Whangarei RC will not be able to hold its race meeting this Saturday 12 July at the Ruakaka Racecourse. This meeting has been transferred to the Avondale JC.

There will be only one minor distance change following the decision to transfer the meeting to Avondale. The R85 Benchmark 1000m will now be run over 1100m. All other race distances, fields and start times will remain the same as they were at Ruakaka.

Any current scratchings will be re-instated. Horses that scratch from the meeting will not be charged a scratching fee.

The meeting will remain a Whangarei RC licence to be run at Avondale Racecourse.

#### **COUNTIES RC - MONDAY 14 JULY**

The Counties RC have avoided the worst of the weather and are planning to race as scheduled on Monday 14 July. Nominations close with the NRB at midday today.

### **ASHBURTON RC - FRIDAY 25 JULY**

# **Turnover Summary Notes**

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 0.8% year to date.
- With 103 less races than run over the same period last season, turnover per race has actually increased, up 2.9%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 1,059, 3.6% less.
- Average field size is 10.44 in FY14, the same as FY13 year to date.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is now 35 higher than a season ago.
- The decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 4.5%) has been partly offset by an increase in FOB turnover (up 12.8%).
- \$NZ export turnover per race to 22 June is down (12.1%). The variance in the \$NZ/\$A exchange rate is responsible for a large proportion of this decline. The remainder, as well as the absence of any growth, appears to have resulted from the loss of coverage on Sky 1 in Australia for midweek races run after 2pm.
