Monday Racing Programme Continues Encouraging Start

The Egmont Racing Club meeting yesterday, 12 March 2012, provided further encouragement to a regular schedule of Monday and Tuesday thoroughbred race meetings.

Egmont's eight-race programme, with a minimum \$7,000 stake, produced an average field size of 10.4 after five scratchings. This is the second week of regular Monday fixtures.

The meeting produced aggregate New Zealand TAB sales of \$599,140 (as compared to \$596,454 last week), and Australian totalisator sales of \$NZ801,838 (as compared to \$1,238,241 last week).

New Zealand off-course totalisator sales were \$452,421 (as compared to \$430,380 last week), on-course totalisator sales were \$55,846 (as compared to \$47,329 last week), fixed odds sales were \$90,873 (as compared to \$118,745 last week), whilst Australian totalisator sales were NZ\$801,838 (as compared to NZ\$1,238,241 last week).

On-course sales were assisted by a public holiday in the Taranaki region (Taranaki Anniversary Day), whilst Australian export sales were impacted by an unusually high number of Australian race meetings due to the Labour Day public holiday in the states of Victoria, South Australia, Tasmania and ACT (Labour Day). The four Australian meetings conducted (two last week), including three metropolitan meetings, resulting in only the first four Egmont races being broadcast in Australia on Sky 1, with races five to eight relegated to Sky 2 after 1 pm AEST.

A summary of New Zealand and Australian wagering on the Egmont meeting is set out below.

TrackWalk for CatWalk

A CatWalk Trust Fundraising Venture

At 6 am this Easter Monday, 9 April, a team of four, led by Lance O'Sullivan ONZM, will start an attempt to run around all 51 licensed thoroughbred racecourses in New Zealand in just 6 days, finishing at Ellerslie at 10.50 am on Saturday, 14 April, Easter Handicap Day.

The aim is to raise money for The CatWalk Spinal Cord Injury Trust www.catwalk.org.nz a charity committed to raising funds to support the body of scientific opinion which says a cure for spinal cord injury will be found. Many Jockeys and Track Riders in thoroughbred racing have suffered spinal injuries in the pursuit of their careers.

O'Sullivan, a Patron of the CatWalk Trust, is joined by three New Zealand racing administrators who came up with the idea – Simon Cooper, from NZ Thoroughbred Racing, Andre Klein from the Otago Racing Club and NZ Jumps Inc, and Jason Fleming from Hawke's Bay Racing.

"We recognise the potential dangers our Jockeys and Track Riders face every day and, with the support of all the Race Clubs around the country and a number of generous sponsors, we are keen to put back into the industry we are all passionate about."

"In doing this we want to make sure we get at least a dollar off everyone we meet on the way, by any means possible, and get people to donate at www.fundraiseonline.co.nz/TrackWalk/ for CatWalk."

"To our knowledge only the late, great Jack Glengarry has run round all the courses in New Zealand but he did it in stages - not in six days. For four guys between the ages of 37 and 52, it will be a great challenge."

Racing turnover was up 0.3% (+\$91k) for the week, Racing Tote was down 5.8% (-\$1.45m) with Domestic tote down 10.5% (-\$1.75m).

Domestic thoroughbreds turnover was down 9.0% (-\$864k) with one additional meeting and just one more race (+1.7%) with horse starts down 0.3%. The top betting race of the week was the Group 1 Stella Artois Auckland Cup with turnover (tote and fob) of \$1.28m, which was up 5.7% on last year (\$1.21m) with just the one extra starter than last year's edition. The other Group 1 features for the week were the New Zealand Stakes (up 6.9%) and the Diamond Stakes (down 1.8%).

Import tote turnover was up 3.4% on the same week last year (+\$295k). Overall 87 more races were taken last week (+10.7%), with 62 North American races taken. The largest import betting race for the week was the Newmarket Handicap which turned over \$267k, up 15.6% on last year (\$231k) with 22 starters versus just the 11 that competed against Black Caviar last year.

FOB Racing, with 99 Final Field Place options offered (\$797k) was up 44% (+\$1.54m) last week (up 50% or \$1.29m domestically), with 130 more options overall (+32%) available than in the same week last year. FOB Racing, with 23 Final Field Place options offered (\$223k) was up 26% (+\$772k) last week (up 25% or \$543k domestically), with 45 more options overall (+11.8%) available than in the same week last year.
