Bill operates Wellfield Lodge stud and took a bit of punt by purchasing Kirramosa's sire Alamosa. He kept him racing in Australia, where he won a Group One, before retiring to stud back here.

Melbourne Cup winning trainer Gai Waterhouse will be represented by a runner in Saturday's New Zealand Bloodstock 41<sup>st</sup> New Zealand 1000 Guineas.

The three-year-old filly Role Model has undergone a change of racing ownership to Round Table Racing, a client of the leading Australian trainer, and was officially transferred from Auckland trainers Peter and Dawn Williams on Tuesday.

Peter and Dawn have a long association with Riccarton Park, having previously trained from the venue and prepared Planet Rock to win the 2011 version of the race, while Waterhouse will be saddling her first runner at Riccarton Park.

Bruce Slade, director of Round Table Racing, is an ex-pat Cantabrian who developed his passion for racing at Riccarton Park and actually lived in a house on the property as a youngster.

Role Model flies to Christchurch on Thursday to take her place in Saturday's Group 1 Classic over the metric mile.

- Total NZ thoroughbred turnover is down 5.1% year to date.
- With 38 less races than run over the same period last season, turnover per race has declined by a smaller 0.5%.
- Total starts made by thoroughbreds in NZ are down 419, 4.8% less.
- Average field size is down marginally from 10.49 in FY13 to 10.47 in FY14, 0.03 (0.2%) less. Field sizes for the week were 0.19 up on the same week last season.
- The number of races with less than 8 starters is 17 higher than a season ago, an improvement of 4 from the week prior.

- Decline in NZ thoroughbred totalisator turnover (down 7.7%) has been partly mitigated by an increase in FOB turnover (up 5.7%).
- Export turnover per race to 31 October is down (17.4%). The main contributors to this is the variance in the \$NZ/\$A exchange rate and a loss in coverage on Sky 1 in Australia for midweek races run after 2pm.

Note: Meetings, races, starters and turnovers are totals of NZRB supplied meeting by meeting turnovers. Off-course turnover is totalisator and FOB combined. On-course turnover is totalisator and FOB racing combined, placed on-course at NZ thoroughbred meetings. Total NZRB racing turnover is NZ thoroughbred, harness, greyhound and all imported racing turnover; total NZRB turnover also includes sport. NZ thoroughbred export turnovers are now included, up to the most recently available meetings. All turnover figures are supplied by the NZRB, derived from various sources.
