From the Horse's Mouth

Last week I talked about the challenges the industry faces.

Yesterday I met with representatives of a number of key stakeholder groups, including the New Zealand Racehorse Owners Federation, the New Zealand Trainers Association, New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders Association and New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing to engage on the strategy that NZTR is proposing be advanced to reinvigorate thoroughbred racing's future. This engagement builds on a number of other facilitated strategy sessions with race clubs and sector groups that NZTR conducted over the last three months.

There are a lot of stakeholders to get around so the Bulletin provides a forum to begin to introduce some of the concepts to be explored. For example, we need to make thoroughbred racing 'more relevant to kiwis.'

We need to look beyond our core 6% of New Zealanders that are interested in thoroughbred racing and broaden our appeal with the 94% of New Zealanders who currently don't see thoroughbred racing as a sport which is fashionable or relevant to them.

To do this we need to work on being seen as an important part of the entertainment industry. This in turn means that we need to work closely with race clubs and other industry stakeholders to look at how together, we might redefine the brand of thoroughbred racing as a sport. We need to review the state of infrastructure and service standards offered on race days and focus on what the customer might want.

There is a lot to be done but working together with race clubs and other stakeholders we will change the trajectory and appeal of our sport.

The only way to break the current cycle is for an industry focused strategic change plan. By working in partnership with race clubs and all stakeholders we are confident that together we can achieve unity, action and vision. There is a lot of work still to be done, sharing of information and consulting. This is a challenging time but it's also an exciting period as together we create a more sustainable industry.

Craig Grylls Returns to NZ

Matamata-based jockey Craig Grylls has returned to New Zealand from a stint in Macau and resumes riding at Ellerslie on Saturday. Grylls decided to prematurely end his three month contract with the Macau Jockey Club favoring the more regular racing schedule in his homeland.

"It was a good experience and I was getting the rides, but they only race once a week in Macau at the moment and I was getting a bit bored between times, so I decided to come home," he said.

Grylls rides Zvonareva, Jubilate, Brandy Belle, Xalted and Peregrine on Saturday.

All's Well With Rogerson Jumpers

Experienced jumpers Morpheus and Zagata have come through their Te Rapa tumbles virtually unscathed. The Graeme and Debbie Rogerson-trained pair both went out of contention in quick succession in the Porritt Sand Waikato Steeplechase when they came to grief at consecutive fences into the home straight for the first time.

Stablemate and last year's Grand National Steeples winner Cape Kinaveral finished third, albeit a distant one behind Kevin Myers' dashing Rioch on Saturday. "They're all right and Morpheus is just a little bit sore over the top, but he'll be fine," Graeme Rogerson said. "His back legs slipped from under him and Zagata clipped heels. "That winner was beautifully presented and he just jumped too well for them."

Rogerson has yet to make any firm plans for Morpheus, who had won his second steeplechase on the opening day of the Te Rapa meeting, while Zagata has Hastings next on his programme. "He'll go to the Hawke's Bay and Cape Kinaveral will probably run in the McGregor Grant," he said. Rogerson has a big team of jumpers in work with last-start winner Zenocoin and It's A Message, runner-up to his barn mate at Paeroa, both also headed to Ellerslie next weekend.
