From the Horse's Mouth

Last week was a great reminder to me of just how exhilarating racing can be, when Banna Strand a horse I part-own, trained by John Wheeler, won Australia's most celebrated steeplechase, the Warrnambool Grand Annual Steeple Chase over 5500 metres and 34 fences.

It had to be the most adrenaline charged, nerve racking and exhilarating 6-48.27 minutes of my life, with Banna Strand coming from last, to claim a last stride victory in front of 14,500 cheering fans.

The win was a credit to John Wheeler and his unswerving confidence in the horse, a 9YO maiden on the flat and steeples, who had recorded just two hurdle wins from his 67 starts.

It was redemption for Banna Strand, who prior to the race was best known as the infamous horse that jumped the outside fence of the Warrnambool racecourse and into the crowd.

For the last week I've been walking around with a smile on my face with the racecallers words ring in my ears, "and it's Banna Strand from villain to hero!"

There's no better feeling than your horse winning, no matter how big or small a share you own. No wonder people are so passionate about racing, the most exhilarating and exciting of all sports.

A little over a year ago, a new structure of racing and prizemoney was introduced by NZTR as part of a new Inter-Code Funding Agreement with Racing Board (NZRB), Harness Racing (HRNZ) and Greyhound Racing (NZGRA) which saw NZTR distributions increase by \$5.3 million from \$64.1 million in FY11 to \$69.5 million in FY12.

The agreement included a commitment for Thoroughbred Racing to provide a continuity of Monday racing and a number of Tuesday racing fixtures, while maintaining the existing number of races.

As summarised below, turnover performance from Monday and Tuesday fixtures is in most cases consistent with, or slightly exceeding NZTR budget expectation.

NZTR analysis indicates:

- \$17.8 million of additional turnover consisting of a -\$3.3 million reduction in domestic sales and a \$21.2 million increase in export sales as a result of transferring races from other days of the week;
- \$100,105 of additional TAB earnings consisting of a -\$471,931 reduction in domestic earnings and a \$572,035 increase in export earnings;
- The changes supported NZRB's current 8.1% increase in domestic and imported thoroughbred sales.

The \$100,105 of additional TAB earnings does not take into account the cost of additional meetings conducted (approximately -\$1.6 million), which was fully funded from the \$5.3 million of additional revenue under the Intercode Agreement, the balance of which was used to fund increased minimum prizemoney levels introduced on 1 March 2012 and recent infrastructure initiatives.

In the upcoming 2013-14 racing season NZTR proposes to schedule 363 thoroughbred meetings, three less than the current year, including:

- -14 Tuesday meetings
- 7 Saturday meetings
- 2 Sunday meetings
- 7 Twilight meetings

NZTR intends to maintain a continuity of Monday racing in the upcoming 2013-2014 season. Growing international revenue is seen by NZTR as critical to our industry's sustainability. A consistency of racing through the week will help grow revenue for New Zealand thoroughbred racing in international markets.

NZ Thoroughbred Clifton Promise Wins World's leading Three Day Event

In a nail-biting show-jumping finale, New Zealander Jonathan ('Jock') Paget turned in the performance of his career so far to lift the Mitsubishi Motors Badminton Horse Trials trophy on NZ Thoroughbred Clifton Promise, registered as Bachelor Boy by Engagement out of Darn Style. The 14 year old bay gelding was bred by Kathryn Joy Abernethy from Mosgiel and was foaled on 11 November 1998. He trialed five times but never raced under Cambridge Trainer Graeme Forbes.

Lying second after the cross-country section, Francis Stead's Clifton Promise went clear in the show-jumping, which required leader Michael Jung with La Biosthetique Sam to do the same to win the event. Jung, the reigning Olympic, World and European Champion looked to have victory in the bag, but a late-falling rail at the final fence saw Clifton Promise and Paget take the Badminton trophy.

"I used to watch videos of Badminton, thinking it would be cool to be there one day - and now I am!" said Jock. "Clifton Promise is quite tricky - it's like riding two different horses. But I've asked him a lot of questions over the past week and he's answered every one."

Paget's other NZ Thoroughbred Clifton Lush, registered as Plato by Half Iced, out of All For Love finished in 14th placing.

NZ Licence Holders - Interaction with Australian Authorities

It is essential that any transaction required to be carried out by New Zealand's National Racing Bureau (NRB) on Australian races must be notified to the NRB at least ONE HOUR prior to advertised closing times in Australia. Canterbury Racing Autumn Carnival

The winner of the NRM Trainers' Prize over the Canterbury Racing Autumn Carnival was Michel Pitman, whose 44 runners accumulated 116 points. In second place John & Karen Parsons' 25 runners accumulated 59 points. The leading horse at the Carnival was Confederate on 21 points, followed by Big Energy on 18 points and The Solitaire on 17 points.

Waverley RC Racemeeting - Thursday 23 May

Please note that the meeting on 23 May is inadvertently listed as being an Otaki-Maori RC meeting to be held at Otaki. Track renovations are taking place at Otaki, which gave rise to the meeting now being a Waverley RC meeting being held at Waverley.

There is a consequential distance change with the 2100m distance races now to be run over 2200m.
